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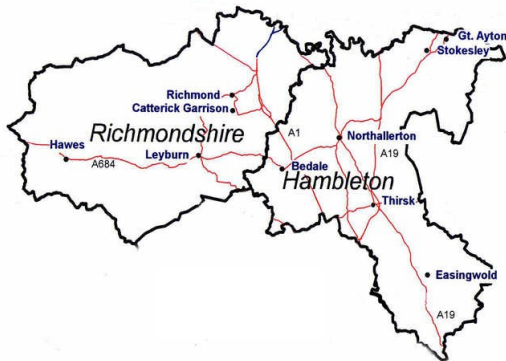

Action for Advocacy

Why do we need you?

We need volunteer advocates to help us maintain our high quality advocacy service to people in Hambleton and Richmondshire and to make the service accessible to more people.

We need to support clients to make their own decisions and choices which will lead to them having more control in their lives.

Who comes to us for support?

Our service is for anybody who needs support in dealing with a difficult situation in their lives.

Who are we and what do we do?

We are an independent Charity offering a free service to people in Hambleton and Richmondshire, with offices in Northallerton and Richmond.

Our staff work closely with our volunteer advocates to provide a confidential service to clients.

What will I do if I become an Advocate?

The volunteer advocate will work in partnership with the staff member and client to identify and work through the client’s issues.

So what do I do next?

An information pack is available from either office. You will be asked to complete the application form and provide references. An enhanced CRB check will be required.

Why become an Advocate?

- To support people to speak up for themselves
- To feel that you are doing something worthwhile
- To gain a knowledge and understanding of the roles of services in the community
- To take part in a comprehensive induction programme
- To take part in other internal and external training
- To have regular support from the staff team
- To enhance your CV to possibly gain further work in the sector

- To be able to listen
- To show empathy
- To act in a confidential manner at all times
- To be approachable and confident
- To be non-judgemental
- To be tenacious
- To be patient
- To have the ability to see the whole picture
- To be able to accept disappointment
- To be able to attend meetings and put client’s views forward
